

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the difference between scholarships and sponsorships? Why do you provide scholarships instead of sponsorships?

Our Support a Student scholarship program differs from many child sponsorship programs. Scholarships give donors the opportunity to reach multiple students whereas sponsorships give donors the opportunity to support only one student at a time. Educate the Nations provides educational scholarships to multiple students in need instead of picking only a few students in which to sponsor. This allows us to broaden our reach and support students through ever changing needs.

How are scholarship recipients chosen?

Students are chosen for an academic scholarship based on their financial need. Scholarship recipients are students who are committed to education yet post the risk of staying in school due to financial limitations.

Why isn't there an option to pick which grade level to support?

We average the cost of tuition, fees, uniforms, and books across all grade levels (including international transfer fee). We do this so that donations can be distributed evenly and fairly, as well as go immediately where there is a need. For instance, it would be hard to support an immediate high school need if most donations went to elementary grades.

How will I know who my donation impacted?

Donors are notified and updated via email, our website, and social media on all students whose education has been supported by a scholarship during that term/school year.
